
Bonny Hills Tennis Club

Native Bees are attracted to the Cadaghi or Cadanga tree (Corymbia Torelliana). This is a species of tree that is endemic to North Queensland. The Cadaghi tree has slowly become a "local" in our area, but our native bees cannot adapt to its gumnuts. These Cadaghi trees commonly have smooth greenish grey bark. Older specimens often have rough, tessellated greyish bark on the lower trunk.

Cadaghi trees flower from August to November and the flowers are white. The gumnuts, or fruit, are woody, urn or capsule shaped with enclosed valves inside. Native bees are attracted to the Cadaghi tree and, unfortunately for our native bees, the gumnuts are laden with resin. The resin causes the seeds within the gumnuts get stuck to the bees. The bees then unwittingly carry the sticky seeds back to their hives.

The result can be blocked entries, over heated hives and ultimately death of the bees. So, if you do spot any of these seeds at the hive entry, clear them away daily and consider relocating your hive temporarily. If there is a Cadaghi tree close by, a new permanent location for your hive may be the best solution. 

BONNY HILLS RURAL FIRE SERVICE

Bonny Hills One along with FRNSW and other RFS units responded to a major gas leak at Kendal Public School 15 February 10am. On arrival it was found that an excavator had severed a underground gas line which could have caused a critical incident had the gas ignited. The school was evacuated while Fire and Rescue NSW isolated the gas leak however, it was several hours before the site was declared safe as gas was still being detected in the drains and low lying areas. The gas was dispersed with fire hoses and the site declared safe around 2pm. The next day Bonny Hills 1 and other units were responded to a vehicle fire at Reflections caravan park Bonny Hills. On arrival it was found a VW Komby had smoke coming from the engine compartment, after investigation it was deemed to be an electrical fault, the Batteries isolated, the vehicle made safe and the owners checking to see if their road side assistance subscription was up to date.

The extensions of the Bonny Hills fire station are now back on track after a major setback with the builder contracted for the job going into liquidation. Construction recommenced last week and we should see things taking shape over the coming months.

Wauchope-Bonny Hills Surf Lifesaving Club proudly keeping our Community safe since 1958

It has been great beach going weather over recent months and the public have enjoyed Rainbow Beach. Your local surf lifesaving club has patrolled the beach for2,637 since the commencement of 22/23 season with over 10,000 recorded visitors. Other statistics are: 352 preventative actions with a number of rescues when swimmers have found themselves in difficult situations and also requiring first aid attention. Patrol duties will conclude Anzac Day. Members are upgrading their skills – Inshore Rescue Crewman training will be held soon and along with some female members upgrading their IRB Drivers qualification. If you wish to become a surf lifesaver, Bronze Medallion courses will be held over the winter months.

Members have been busy attending carnivals to extend their skills. Nippers (both experienced and those new to the organisation) have competed at carnivals from South West Rocks to Cape Hawke at State Country Championships. Some gold and silver 'bling' was displayed by our young members. Tori McGrath and Alex Slavin proudly represented WBHSLSC at the LSMNC Newcastle Permanent Junior Lifesavers of the Year –

congratulations Tori and Alex. The Nippers will wrap up their season with a Presentation afternoon towards the end of the month. All members will be acknowledged along with the generous major sponsors – Port Macquarie Orthodontics and Lake Cathie Little Learners.

Senior members have also competed from Yamba to Kiama with many beaches in between. Since a Bronze Squad gained their qualification early in the season, some members have been testing their balance on skis and boards and competing at carnivals. Other members have formed boat crews; great to see them competing in the Under 19 category.


